The installation of cameras with in-room sound sensors is designed to improve residents' quality of life.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Clinical Use

The in-room camera is used following a clinical assessment. It is part of the resident's personalized intervention plan.

Consent Required

The use of an in-room camera requires the free and informed consent of the resident and his or her representative, if applicable. This consent may be withdrawn at any time.

Preventive Use

The camera is used as a complementary tool to respond to specific clinical situations, for example:

- respect for sleep;
- fall prevention;
- behavioral disorders.

It does not replace the presence of staff, nor is it a means of monitoring the delivery of care and services. Its objective is strictly focused on the well-being and safety of residents.

Control Switch

A switch allows the resident or their relatives to turn off the camera if necessary.

Privacy

Images and recordings, where applicable, respect standards of confidentiality and privacy.

Note that common areas are equipped with security cameras to ensure the general safety of all.

The use of surveillance mechanisms by residents is also permitted.
